More than 300 full-time schools, technical schools and universities (both public and private), educating around 400,000 students, contribute to the progress of our educational indexes. The leadership and technical perfection of our students and teachers are stimulated by exchange programs and internships, helping to prepare a competent workforce for industry, commerce, the rural areas and the technological hubs of the region, such as Campina Grande (Latin America's most advanced).

The fiscal balance, dependable payment of servants and suppliers, together with the large and regular investments in construction and in economic and social programs (such as 'Empreender Paraíba', a program to offer low-interest loans to small and medium-sized businesses), ensure Paraíba's place at the forefront of national development. Paraíba has earned its place as regional leader in competitiveness and entrepreneurship. Public safety is another factor which sets Paraíba apart nationally, with annual reductions of crime rates, creating a favorable environment for anyone who wants to invest and live in our cities.

With a strong economy, hardworking and welcoming people, an extensive infrastructure and investments in lasting work fronts (such as the tourism hub of João Pessoa, the capital), Paraiba faces a promising future with few barriers. strategic Paraíba enjoys a Location, both economically and geographically. Not only is it the most eastern state of the Americas, closest to both Europe and Africa, Paraíba also shares its border with two great northeastern markets, connected conveniently by ground or air. Paraíba´s economy is currently one of the most prosperous in Brazil. The last decade has seen Paraíba enjoy the strongest economic growth throughout the northeastern region making it the 6th strongest in the country. The strength of the maturing market is evident in the following figures, and it is ready to develop even further in the future.

There has never been a better time to choose Paraíba. The state continues as the most competitive in the northeast with the 5th largest consumer market in the region. In 2019, the two largest consumer hubs, João Pessoa (the capital) and Campina Grande, attained a capacity of R\$ 25,9 billion. This represents almost 40% of the state's total consumption (R\$ 65,3 billion). A 120 km dual national highway in superior condition connects the two cities. The potential combined consumer market of João Pessoa and the neighboring northeastern state capitals exceeds R\$ 78 billion. These three cities lie within a 287 km radius and are interconnected by a major national highway.

### **B RATING – FISCAL SOUNDNESS**

Paraíba has maintained its efficiency rating in Fiscal Administration for three consecutive years, as determined by the Secretary of the National Treasury. The index also allows the state to contract new credit operations, permitting not only structural investments, but also the maintenance of local economic activity. Paraíba earned an A-rating in the requirements of indebtedness and liquidity earlier this year, with a B-rating only in the index of Current savings. Espírito Santo was the only state in Brazil to receive an A-rating in this category.



Paraiba offers excellent an environment for business. Thanks to an administration committed to providing national and international investors with maximum support and pace, the local economy is dynamic, generating wealth and jobs for the whole state.

### **CONVENTION CENTER**

Located in João Pessoa, this new establishment is among the country's most modern, boasting four great structures: the 'Mirante Tower', the 'Market and Exposition Pavilion', the 'Congress and Convention Pavilion', as well as the 'Pedra do Reino' theatre. The project can host events such as markets, expositions, conferences, congresses, as well as grand theatrical and concert performances.

### **CABO BRANCO TOURIST HUB**

Paraíba plans to house the largest tourist complex throughout the northeastern region. It is currently in the implementation phase and will encompass resorts, hotels, a new convention center, golf course and an extensive network of commerce and services. Located picturesquely between the ocean shore and a natural Atlantic forest reserve, this unique project will promote tourism to a new level, not only in Paraíba but across neighboring states.

### CLEAN ENERGY FROM *Paraíba*.



Paraíba has a high potential for production of renewable energy in Brazil. The geographical features provide an unrivalled environment, highly amenable to the installation of wind and solar energy generators.



Estimated capacity (onshore): **10,2 GW** at a height of **120 meters**, 11 times higher than 2018's production capacity. Paraíba will be home to Latin America's largest wind complex, with an installed total capacity of **565 MW**, of which **157 MW** is already in operation.



Figures from the Energy Research Enterprise (EPE, 2019) show 76 renewable energy projects in Paraíba registered at the "A-6" auction on October 17th, 2019. Out of these **76 projects**, **52 projects** denoted wind energy, totalling **1.871 MW**; 24 projects were solar power, totalling **727 MW**. The "A-6" auction considers projects which should assume operation six years after contract.



Paraíba has among the highest indexes of solar insolation levels in Brazil. In reality, areas such as Paraíba's outback boast indexes of solar insolation like few others on Earth. These favourable conditions make Paraíba a strategic state for production of future energy. At present, Coremas and Angicos/Malta produce **93 MW** with the capacity for a further **261 MW** under construction.



### DISTRIBUTED GENERATION

Figures from the National Agency of Electric Energy (ANEEL, July of 2019), place Paraiba third among states in the northeast region for the number of consumer units to generate their own energy. **1,354 installations** represent an installed potential of **18 MW** in photovoltaic solar panels





Concerning Technology and Innovation, Paraíba is of national importance. Made possible through the 'Plan for Sustainable Economic and Social Development in Paraíba' (PLADES), real production networks were created all over the state, including institutions for further education, fiber optics infrastructure, other infrastructure, development agencies and incentives proven to stimulate economic potential.

Paraíba has implemented among the largest scale programs to guarantee the state's hydraulic security. Furthermore, Paraíba is among the foremost beneficiaries in the 'Transposition of the São Fransisco River' project, which will guarantee year-round water access.

The Acauã/Araçagi canal is the largest hydraulic construction in the state, extending 130,44 km, benefiting over 630,000 people, and guaranteeing the productive potential of over 16,000 hectares of land.

As a result of the program, in excess of 1,500 km of water mains have either been or are under construction.





36 power plants currently operate in Paraíba, with an installed total capacity of 888,26 MW. The transmission system runs through the state, meeting the energy demands of all its regions.

Administrated by Companhia Docas da Paraíba, the port of Cabedelo is a strategic point for national and international cargo shipping. Cabedelo's privileged geographical position, integrated road network and cost effectiveness, renders the port an excellent choice for maritime logistics. The port has many added advantages:



Lower tariffs in comparison with the ports in Recife (Pernambuco) and Natal (Rio Grande do Norte);
